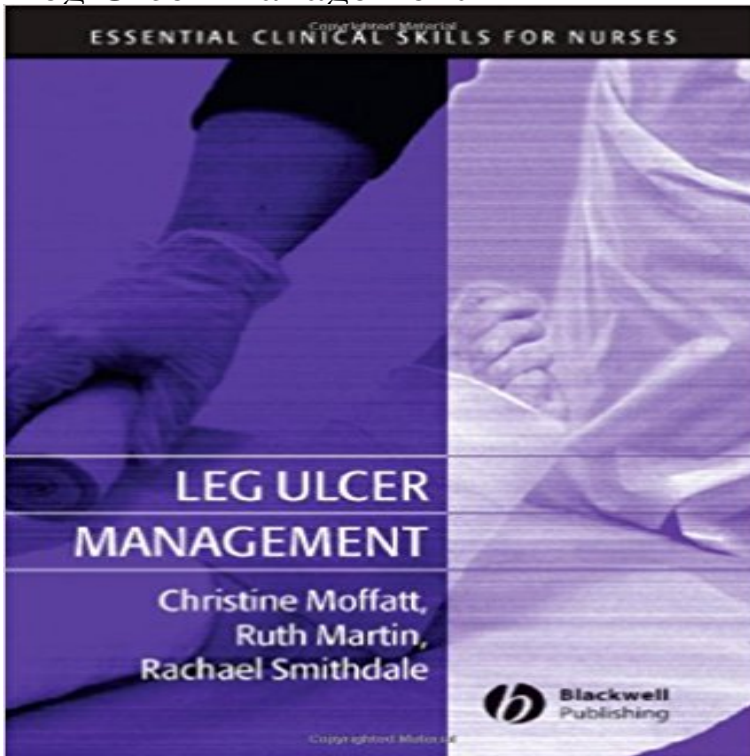


Leg Ulcer Management
