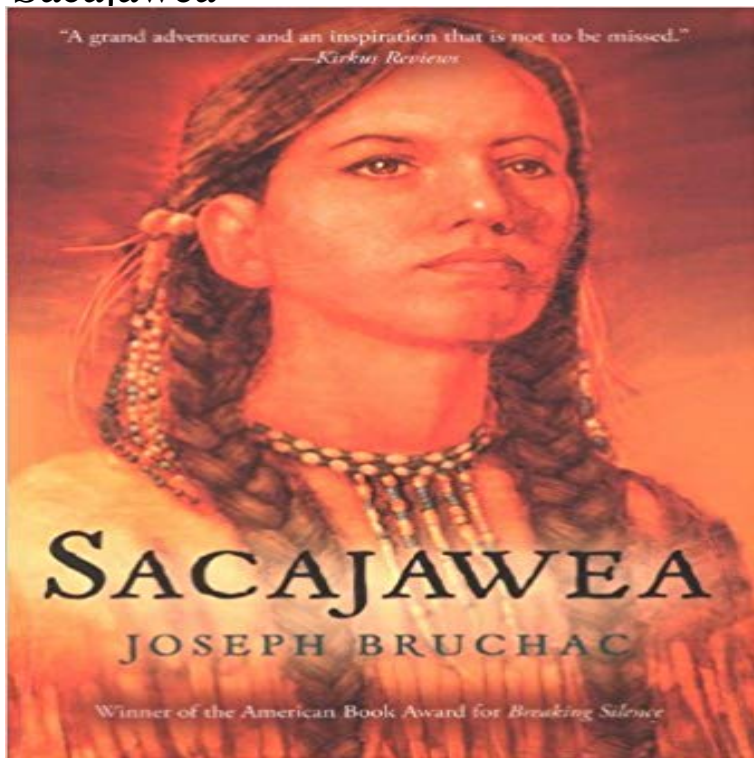


Sacajawea
